What is the Government Doing?



In February, we heard from two federal agencies at different points on the path to implementing robust data-sharing policies.

Highlights:

- Data-sharing should be the default practice
- Data-sharing is complex a one-size-fits-all approach might not work immediately at scale
- It costs money and resources to share data funding this work should be a part of the conversation
- To have a robust data-sharing policy, you need the knowledge of what "good" is, how to incorporate an evaluation into peer review, and how to track compliance





- Lack of Internal Expertise
- Lack of Enforcement/Compliance and Staff Capacity

Thinking About It




- Finding the best way to "soften the ground"
