Close to 200 members attended the <u>Spring Meeting</u> virtually, which addressed issues like <u>RFA development</u>, <u>patient engagement</u>, and <u>impact</u> <u>evaluation</u> of grants programs presented by Jocelyn LeBlanc from the Association of Medical Research Charities. <u>Venture philanthropy</u> was also discussed with special guest Lisa Richter, co-founder of Aviva Capital.

The <u>Fall Meeting</u> addressed some of the most timely questions on members' minds including responses to the <u>COVID-19 crisis</u> and <u>resiliency and sustainability in</u> fundraising. Hannah Valantine, the NIH's first



diversity officer, presented <u>opportunities to achieve diversity and inclusion</u> in biomedical research. HRA also hosted its first ever CEO roundtable with 50 organizations represented.

Flexibility and Responsiveness

HRA's flexibility enabled timely responses to the rapidly evolving challenges of 2020. To help members, HRA gathered and developed <u>resources</u>, curated <u>funder responses</u> to the crisis, compiled <u>post-COVID-19 recommendations for</u>



<u>supporting early career researchers</u>, and guidelines for transitioning to <u>virtual</u> <u>meetings</u>.



Diversity, equity, and inclusion has long been a focus of HRA. For example, <u>regional meeting</u> and <u>Member Meeting</u> sessions in 2018 were dedicated to diversifying the biomedical research workforce. 2020 brought the issue to the forefront again. This year, HRA created a <u>new working</u> <u>group</u> to address DEI, <u>hosted a session</u> during the Fall

2020 Members Meeting, and gathered a wealth of <u>resources</u> for member organizations. HRA also contracted with <u>BMe</u> to offer DEI training workshops in 2021.


Response to the COVID-19 Crisis

- <u>Assessing the needs of grantees</u> HRA compiled a list of questions and analyzed data from surveys members used early in the pandemic to assess the needs of their awardees. Other members used those questions in subsequent grantee surveys. A <u>meta-analysis of results</u> was presented at the Fall 2020 Meeting.
- <u>Reimagine Biomedical Research</u> In partnership with PLOS, this Essay Challenge is designed to solicit bold ideas for systemic changes to how we support biomedical research. Essays due March 11, 2021.
- <u>Running a successful Virtual Peer Review</u> Guidance and tips from HRA members experienced in running virtual peer review.

Making Data Available and Accessible



Available to all members, <u>HRA Analyzer</u> is a powerful database of grant data. It contains over 61,000 grants totaling \$18.7B from HRA members, over 450,000 NIH grants, and 31,000,000 publications. This searchable database allows members to analyze their own grant data, compare to others in the

same area, or benchmark against NIH funding. A 6-part <u>webinar series</u> will help you get started.

Strategic Plan

In 2020, HRA began the process of revising the strategic plan. The committee, with the help of many of you through surveys and conversation, will roll out a plan in 2021 that continues to build on the mission of accelerating the pace



of scientific discovery and embodies the community-driven, problem-solving, and forward-thinking ethos of HRA.


NOVEMBER 3 & 4, 2021
