Data Sharing

Is your organization considering whether to implement a data sharing policy, but you're not sure where to start? Already started the process, but running into challenges? Want to learn more about organizations that currently require data sharing of their grantees? If any of these situations apply, please join us! The goal of this session is twofold: (1) to energize and engage members who want to become active participants in the Data Sharing Working Group, and (2) to begin building a "roadmap" together that outlines steps to draft, implement, and monitor a data policy. The roadmap will include (but is not limited to): getting buy-in from board members; considering parameters for a plan based on an individual organization's goals; drafting the text of a policy; communicating with grantees; selecting data repositories; and revising grant administration policies. In discussing these concrete steps, we will also consider the overall paradigm shift and organizational change management required for successful adoption of a policy. Joining us in conversation and to share their experiences will be Chris Percopo (Director of Grants Mangement) and Scott Kahn (Data Strategist), who led the effort to institute a data sharing policy at The Leona M. and Harry B. Helmsley Charitable Trust. After the session, we will compile information and feedback to get a more complete picture of where HRA member organizations are in the process of creating data policies, as well as the type of resources they need. Your feedback will help guide future webinars, discussions, and resource curation, so please bring your questions, suggestions, and ideas!
